# UNITED STATES INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

United States International University was established to emphasize areas of human concern and leadership where people work with people — such areas as Human Behavior, Education, Law, Business, International Relations and the full program of the Arts and Sciences.


Since the early days of the University it was planned to expand the institution into a multi-campus international university. This approach was chosen in order to enable the University to grow without destroying one of its major objectives, that of offering undergraduate education on campus areas with a small enrollment so that the student is able to feel a part of a real campus life.

### **ORGANIZATION**

The University includes two undergraduate Colleges of Arts and Sciences, the Graduate School of Business Administration, the School of Law, the Graduate School of Leadership and Human Behavior, the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, the School of Performing Arts, the Center for Urban and Human Development, and the Institute for Educational Management.

The University has five campuses — three in San Diego, one in Steamboat Springs, Colorado, and one in Buckinghamshire, England. The First College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Law are located on the original campus on Point Loma, the California Western Campus. The downtown Center for the Performing Arts includes Central Administration and the School of Performing Arts. The Elliott Campus includes the Second College of Arts and Sciences and all the graduate programs except the School of Law and the Master in Fine Arts. The Colorado Alpine Campus in Steamboat Springs, Colorado, is the site of the University's Intensive Study Program. U.S. International University in England, 24 miles from London, is the first of a number of projected "university centers abroad."

United States International University is private and independent and is a California non-profit corporation.



DR. NORRIS A. PATTERSON
Director of Athletics

Dr. Norris A. Patterson joined USIU last spring as Director of Athletics and Physical Education after a coaching career of 22 years, including 18 years at William Jewell College in Liberty, Missouri.

At William Jewell Dr. Patterson handled the dual positions of head football coach and Director of Physical Education.

His lifetime coaching record shows an impressive 166 games won, 37 lost and 10 tied for a percentage of .833. His teams won 11 conference championships, he had 7 runnerup teams, tied in two bowl appearances and never experienced a losing season.

In 1968, his last year at William Jewell, his team went undefeated in  $10\ \text{straight}$  games.

Dr. Patterson is a member of the executive committee, Division of Men's Athletics of the American Association of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, and a member of the Joint Committee of NCAA, College Physical Education Association and American Association of Health and Physical Education. He was elected to the NAIA Football Hall of Fame in 1968.

He has a number of publications to his credit, including "Group Dynamics in Coaching Football," "Are Little Leaguers Too Big for their Britches?", "Five Rules for Selecting Players," and "Financial Aid for Student-Athletes in the Non-Subsidized Program."

He received his B.A. from Missouri Valley College in 1939, M.A. from the U. of Missouri at Kansas City in 1950, and Ed.D. from Columbia University in 1958.

### THE USIU STAFF



MARV BRADEN Head Football Coach

Marv Braden, who coached the past two seasons at Northeast Missouri State College in Kirksville, Missouri, is a newcomer to California football and is the third head coach in USIU's 12 years of competing in the gridiron sport.

He had a 9-9 record for two years at Northeast Missouri State College, despite the fact that during his tenure there he had only 11 seniors.

Prior to his head coaching position Braden served an apprenticeship that included assistant posts at the University of Missouri, Lafayette College in Easton, Pa., and Parsons College in Iowa.

He is a native of Kansas City, Mo., where he starred in football, basketball, baseball and track for Westport High School. He played three years of football for Southwest Missouri State College and received his B.S. in Education from that school. He received his Masters Degree in Education from the University of Missouri in Columbia, Mo.

Braden, 32, sees his position with USIU as a real challenge and he plans to use the Pro Slot-I offense.

# LEW ERBER Assistant Football Coach

Lew Erber returns to San Diego, where he served on the coaching staffs of St. Augustine High School (1959-62) and Grossmont Junior College (1962-65) early in his career.

Last season he was head coach at Imperial Valley Junior College, a position he took after one year with Wichita State U. and another season with Iowa State U.

He is a native of New Jersey and graduated from Englewood High School, where he played football, basketball and track. He continued his career at Montclair State College in New Jersey, where he earned four letters each in football, basketball and track. He received his Masters Degree in Business Administration in 1964 from San Diego State College.

# ROBERT C. BASS Assistant Football Coach

For the past two years Robert C. Bass has served on the coaching staff at Monte Vista High School in San Diego County. Prior to that he coached at the University of Hawaii and Pioneer High School in San Jose.

He is a graduate of Pacific High School in San Bernardino, where he played four years of varsity football. He continued his athletic career at San Jose State College and, besides three years of football on the varsity, also earned letters in wrestling and judo.

# GARY BEETS Graduate Assistant

Gary Beets, who played last year on an undefeated football team at William Jewell College in Kirksville, Mo., is beginning his first coaching assignment.

He is a native of Kansas City, Mo., and was outstanding in high school before playing for Dr. Norris A. Patterson, the new USIU athletic director. At William Jewell he was co-captain and played four years varsity on offense and defense. He was an all-conference linebacker three years and received NAIA All-America honorable mention.

### JERRY LYBARGER Graduate Assistant

Jerry Lybarger, who has entered the USIU Law School, was an outstanding guard and linebacker the past two years at Northeast Missouri State College where he played for Coach Marv Braden.

He will coach the guards and linebackers at USIU and his excellent competitive attitude is expected to be a big help in his first coaching assignment.

# DEE SPEAKES Equipment Manager

Dee Speakes is in his seventh year with USIU as equipment manager. He handles the ordering, issuing and upkeep of equipment for all sports at the University, including physical education classes and such sports teams as football, cross country, basketball, baseball, golf, track and tennis.

He is a native of Pleasanton, Kansas, and was with the Boeing Company in Wichita for 12 years before coming to California, where he was employed for two years by Convair prior to joining the USIU staff.

### RIC McDONALD Athletic Trainer

With a background of two years as assistant trainer with the University of Utah, Ric McDonald is the new trainer at USIU.

He holds a BS Degree from the University of Utah and a degree in Physical Therapy from the University of California Medical Center in San Francisco.

He is a native of Salt Lake City, Utah, where he played varsity football and wrestled for East Lake High School.

Dr. Crakes, who also is head coach of track for USIU, came to San Diego from Cal State, Los Angeles where

He is a native of Eugene, Ore., and earned a B.S. in Physical Education at the University of Oregon. In 1954 he was awarded a Certificate in Physical Therapy by New York University and two years later he added an M.A. from the University of Oregon. In 1960 the same school awarded him a Ph.D. Both degrees were in Physical Education.

pected to be big pointmakers this season.

Dr. Crakes expects help from Andy Dunstan and Juan Valdez, a pair of returning lettermen, along with several junior college transfers and incoming freshmen.

Among the newcomers expected to provide help are: Dan Ungritch, from Grossmont College; O. J. Romo, recent standout at San Diego City College; Daryl Simmons, a Helix High School product who had a best mile time of 4:19.8; Tim Oliver, from South Torrance High School who ran the mile in 4:24; Daniel Swehosky of Taft High School in San Fernando Valley and Gary Webber of Tustin High School in Santa Ana.

Additional depth to bolster the squad is expected from Greg Williams, and Pete Connally, who were 440 and 880 runners on the USIU track team the past two

vears
