

Imperial High Priest and Prophet
Order of the Mystic Shrine

C. P. (Chick) MacGregor, elected Imperial High Priest and Prophet at the 93rd annual session of the Imperial Council held in Washington, D.C., July 1967. MacGregor, a Past Potentate of Al Malaikah Temple, is the fourth Noble from the Los Angeles-based unit to be selected to the Imperial line in the 77-year history of the Temple.

This Imperial Divan member was raised in his Blue Lodge in 1925, is a member of both Scottish and York Rites, and was created a Noble at Al Malaikah in 1937.

As Imperial High Priest and Prophet, MacGregor takes over duties as administrative officer of national Shrine's multi-million dollar philanthrophic projects — including the Los Angeles unit, Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children, beneficiary of the net proceed's from tonight's contest.

He also rules over 18 other hospitals for crippled children and a trio of institutions devoted solely to burn cases.

Al Bahr Temple gives a hearty welcome to "Chick" for taking time out to attend Al Bahr's charity football game.

## SHRINE CRIPPLED CHILDRENS HOSPITALS

## to Benefit from Tonight's Football Game

The Nobles of Al Bahr Temple are privileged to welcome you, the sports fans and true supporters of Shrine crippled childrens hospitals, to this fourth renewal of what has come to be regarded as one of the outstanding football contests on the Pacific Coast.

Tonight's game sees two undefeated small college elevens emphasizing the theme that dominates all Shrine-sponsored football activity—"Where Strong Legs Run That Weak Legs May Walk." To the players from California Western University and Eastern Washington State College, Shrine Nobles everywhere doff their fezes in a gracious "thank you." The renewed series of Shrine charity football games saw Cal Western fall before a powerful University of Hawaii contingent 24-3 in 1964. Then, in 1965, the redoubtable Aztecs of San Diego State College humbled the Zips of the University of Akron 41-0. Cal Western, under new head coach Bob Dinaberg, did battle with

California State Polytechnic of San Luis Obispo in 1966, losing 21-3. With a current 1-2 record, San Diego's representative team will be seeking tonight to even the score against a behemoth from the Pacific Northwest that has lost only one game in its last 14 starts.

Guiding the destinies of this and the two preceding Shrine charity football contests is a Noble of Al Bahr Temple who literally wears two hats—that of Oriental Guide as well as Game Managing Director. On the broad shoulders of Victor Stewart has fallen the time-consuming, detail-ridden task of bringing together the great spectacle that is being presented here in San Diego Stadium tonight. For Vic Stewart, the Shrine game is a labor of love—a task that consumes most of his waking hours as Al Bahr's biggest yearly event draws to its realization. To Vic Stewart and all of his hard-working committeemen, the Nobles of Al Bahr say "well done."





One young lady who is "always on the ball" is nine-year-old Shawn Easter of Poway, who has been under the care of Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children for the past seven years. Shawn lost her leg while very young and was taken to the Shrine hospital in Spokane, Washington, where doctors fitted her with a prosthesis. Since then, Shawn visits the Los Angeles unit every four months for adjustments. With her are California University coach Bob Dinaberg and Al Bahr Temple Illustrious Potentate Superior Court Judge Verne O. Warner.

Riding high on the arms of California Western University teammates Jackman LeBlanc (left) and Jim Spellman is nine-year-old Iris Artenstein of Tijuana, the youngster who today is an active, normal child after suffering burns over 65 per cent of her body in a home fire three years ago. Her recovery, authorities believe, is due in large measure to the outstanding treatment Iris received during the five visits she has made to the Shriners Hospital for Burned Children in Galveston, Texas.



California Western University, a division of United States International University, is a private, independent university accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

The campus, located on San Diego's picturesque Pt. Loma, houses the College of Arts and Sciences, the Schools of Business and Economics, Education and Law, as well as the Graduate Studies Division.

In a setting of 140 acres of wooded land providing an unsurpassed view of the Pacific Ocean, California Western University offers its students modern dormitories and classrooms, a library with a capacity for 500,000 volumes, one of the finest gymnasiums in all of Southern California, a new baseball diamond and courts for intramural sports.

Student activities, so much a part of campus life, are as varied as the interests of the young adults who comprise a college community. They run the gamut from intercollegiate de-

bates to dances, from a model United Nations to service clubs and athletic events. There are no sororities or fraternities.

With Los Angeles to the north, Mexico to the south, the mountains and desert to the east and the Pacific to the immediate west—the campus has its own shoreline and beach—California Western University is an outstanding institution in the center of an area affording diverse activities.

Students have access to many educational, cultural and recreational opportunities found only in a cosmopolitan area—the art centers, museums, theater groups, Palomar Observatory, Starlight Opera, San Diego Symphony Orchestra, concerts, forums, outstanding speakers and major fine arts productions.

A sister campus, the Elliott Campus, under construction north of the city of San Diego, while the University's School of Performing Arts uses facilities in the heart of downtown San Diego.

Eastern Washington State College celebrated its 75th birthday in 1965. Its history has centered around a firm and proud commitment to training teachers for the public schools of the State of Washington. Beginning in 1890 as Cheney Normal School, teacher training was its sole responsibility. Even when the name was changed in 1937 to Eastern Washington College of Education, preparing teachers remained the primary mission. But new functions, new responsibilities have emerged in recent years—especially since Eastern became a "state college" in 1961. EWSC is now a growing, respected liberal arts college offering sound programs in over 40 areas of study.

Enrollment increases have been no less than fantastic. In 1954 there were 1000 students. This fall, a short 13 years later, the official enrollment figure will approach 5000. Most of Eastern's students—about 60%—come from

the city of Spokane with the greatest share of them commuting daily. The campus is a quick 15 minutes from downtown Spokane. Most of the route is freeway. Nearly 90% of the student body is from the eastern half of the State, an area known as the Inland Empire. Because of the large commuting population and the close proximity to Spokane (pop. 190,000), EWSC can be regarded as a metropolitan institution.

Rapid enrollment increases has, as might be expected, been accompanied by the need for a major building program. Seven million dollars of classroom and residence hall construction has been completed in the past two years, and an additional sixteen million is underway or on the drawing boards. A new library, named for the late President Kennedy, opened a few weeks ago. Construction cost \$2½ million. Its design has been praised by librarians throughout the nation.
